NORTH LONDON

Heat & Power Project update

This month's NLHPP update comes from Barry Card, LEL/NHLPP Waste Operations Lead.

"Work is well underway for the construction of our Temporary Bulk Waste Recycling Facility. With completion set for early March 2022, the current FFP & BW will be relocated temporarily to allow for the next phase of the NLHPP project. This will be handing over the existing FPP and the northeast corner of the EcoPark to the demolition contractor for the demolition and preparatory works needed for the construction Energy Recovery Facility to get underway.

"South of the site, we are nearing completion of a smaller building at the foot of the EfW down ramp, which will be for the new switchgear when this is completed in the first quarter of 2022. This will allow LondonEnergy to provide power for the new Resource Recovery Facility, which will consist of both a Reuse Recycling Centre and a Resource Fuel Preparation Facility, due for completion at the end of 2022.

"The RRC will be a new addition to our existing six recycling centres, and for the first time, will see the public accessing the EcoPark to use this recycling centre. We will also see the completion and the opening of EcoPark House, due for completion at the end of December 2022.



"Meanwhile, construction of the Lee Valley Heating Network plant on Advent Way is in full swing and should be completed by the first quarter of 2023. Once up and running,

this will take energy from the ERF to heat up to ten thousand homes in the local area.

flowerpots


